Information Items

- Parents/guardians wishing to register their child in Grade 1 Early French Immersion or Grade 6 Late French Immersion for the 2026–2027 school year are asked to complete the electronic registration form: [ASD-S French Immersion Registration 2026-2027 School Year – Fill out form.](#) The registration form will remain open until February 27, 2026. If unable to complete the form electronically, families should contact Hayley Carson at (506) 658-5915 for assistance.
- Our sit-down **breakfast program** runs from 7:45-8:00 daily while our Grab and Go option (breakfast bar and apple) is available until 8:30. Thank you to our volunteers who help each morning.
- Keeping our school safe for everyone is a top priority. School must be a place where children and adults feel secure, respected, and supported. Physical violence is not tolerated at our school. If a student engages in physical aggression, they will be removed from the situation and may be sent home to ensure the safety of others. When the student is calm and ready to return, school staff will work with the child and family to build strategies and develop support plans that help the student learn safer ways to manage challenges and be successful at school. Our approach is always focused on teaching skills and providing support, while maintaining clear expectations for safety. Thank you for your partnership as we work together to keep our school a safe place for all.
- Morning supervision begins at 7:45 a.m. To help us keep all students safe, please avoid dropping your children off before that time, as staff are not outside to supervise earlier arrivals.
- Outdoor play is essential for children's well-being. Research shows it supports physical health, boosts mood, strengthens social skills, and enhances learning. To ensure students benefit from this valuable time outdoors, they will go outside each day except during heavy rain or when temperatures fall below -20°C . Please help your child enjoy their time outdoors by making sure they are dressed comfortably and appropriately for the weather.
